Solar control audit introduced at Energy Expo

Technologies that drive energy efficiencies in buildings will be playing a prominent role at this year's Energy Expo (London Olympia, October 7th-8th).

At the show, Bekaert Specialty Films is announcing the UK availability of CAPSOL, an energy-efficiency audit that helps businesses measure the impact of solar heat gain on, and the likely cost of cooling, their office buildings. The service is used to predict the impact of retro-fitting solar control window film along with an accurate assessment of the resulting reduction in the building's annual cooling costs.
